Purpose of the Assignment:

The Program Officer will support implementation and coordination of HIV prevention and testing interventions across community and facility platforms, strengthening linkages between TI, ICTC, DSRC, and ART services to improve early diagnosis and linkage to care in alignment with 95–95–95 goals.

Key Responsibilities

The consultant will be responsible for the following:

- Support implementation of HIV prevention and testing interventions across community and facility settings in Mumbai in alignment with national guidelines.
- Strengthen coordination between Targeted Interventions (TI), ICTCs, DSRCs, CSCs, and ART centres to improve service uptake and continuity.
- Support HIV case identification strategies including index testing, Assisted Partner Notification, and social and sexual network strategies (SNS).
- Facilitate implementation of targeted testing approaches for priority and high-risk populations to reduce missed opportunities for HIV diagnosis.
- Support linkage of individuals testing HIV-positive to ART centres, with emphasis on reducing pre-ART loss to follow-up.
- Coordinate closely with community-based teams and facility staff to ensure smooth referrals, accompaniment, and follow-up.
- Support documentation and tracking of prevention and testing outcomes across supported facilities.

- Participate in joint reviews, coordination meetings, and planning processes with MDACS and facility partners.
- Undertake regular field visits to TI sites, ICTCs, DSRCs, and ART centres to support implementation and problem-solving.
- Provide inputs to progress reports, reviews, and documentation related to prevention and testing components.
- Support alignment of prevention and testing activities with broader HIV care and treatment goals.
- Perform other responsibilities commensurate with the role as assigned by the State Technical Lead or Alliance India.

- Graduate degree in social sciences, public health, health management, or a related field.
- Postgraduate qualification desirable.

Experience

- Minimum 5 years of experience in HIV prevention and testing programs.
- Experience working with TI projects, ICTCs, and government health systems preferred.

- Good understanding of HIV prevention strategies and national testing guidelines.
- Strong coordination, communication, and field engagement skills.
- Ability to work with multiple stakeholders at community and facility levels.
- Commitment to rights-based and stigma-free HIV responses.
